## PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

### NEW EDUCATION POLICY-2020

#### CHANGE IN PARADIGM OF EDUCATION

Education is a leading determinant of economic growth, employment, and earnings.

The education policy of a country is changed periodically to improve the quality of education, which in turn assists the country's growth. Education policy always focuses on providing education to all the nation's citizens. After National Education Policy 1986, there was no change in education policy, and it was essential to evolve the country's education policy which would aim at the holistic development of citizens with the inculcation of traditional Indian knowledge in the modern education system.

On July 29, 2020, the union Cabinet approved the National Education Policy 2020(NEP), designed to transform India's school and higher education system. Eminent scientists and educationists framed this policy under the chairmanship of eminent scientist Dr.K.Kasturirangan.

The existing academic structure of 10 +2 consisting of the age groups of 6-16 years will now be changed to the 5 +3 +3 +4 model.

The objective of the NEP is to revolutionise school and higher education. This policy includes humanitarian and constitutional values, creativity and critical thinking, use of technology by imparting multidisciplinary education. This policy also focuses on education in the mother tongue By 2030 there shall be at least one large multidisciplinary institution in every district. By 2040 all higher education institutes shall aim to become a multidisciplinary institution each containing 3000 or more students. The existing system is marks-oriented and certificate oriented and does not focus on skills, or universal human values. The significant changes in higher education are there will be teaching universities, and research degree universities and higher education institutions will be degree-awarding institutions instead of affiliation to award degrees.



NEP-2020 proposed the duration of the undergraduate program from 3-4 years and the option to exit from the program with a certificate, diploma and degree either in honours or research.

Flexibility will be given to the students to select courses across the faculty. The credit earned by the students will be deposited in the Academic Bank of credit(ABC). The post-graduate programme will be of one-year or two-year duration. The opportunity will be given to the student to take Ph.D. programme directly after graduation.

In Maharashtra, all the institutes and universities will be implementing four-year degree programmes, which will give a new dimension to the current fixed education system, which will require a change in pedagogy. The mindset of students, parents and teachers will be required to change. This will give wings to the students to embrace global changes in the world.

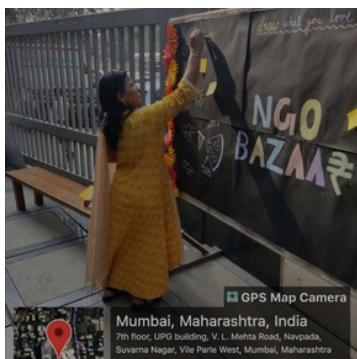
### Institutional Social Responsibility Committee (ISR)

#### Activities in January 2023:

##### The NGO Bazaar

Mithibai ISR invited 12 NGOs over the course of 2 days (24th and 25th January, 2023) to set up stalls of products made at their respective NGOs on campus for raise funds to continue working for their cause. 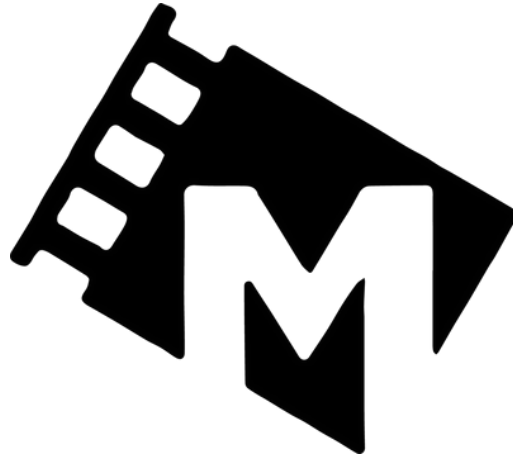

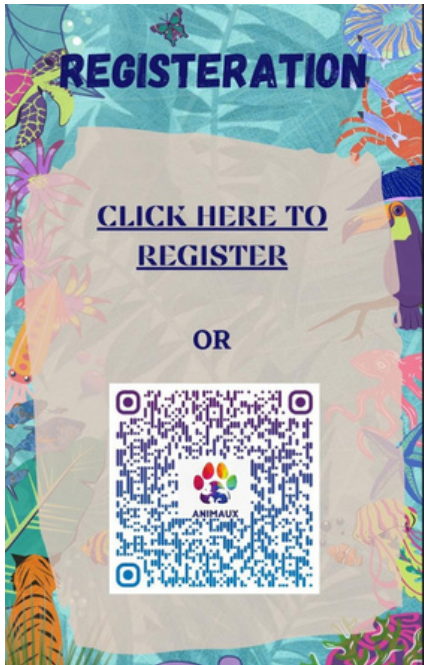

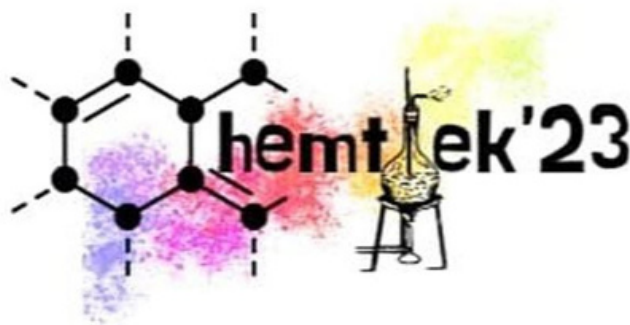
#### RECENT ADVANCES IN CHEMICAL SCIENCES (RACS 2023)

The Department of Botany invites and welcomes everyone to come and inspire us.

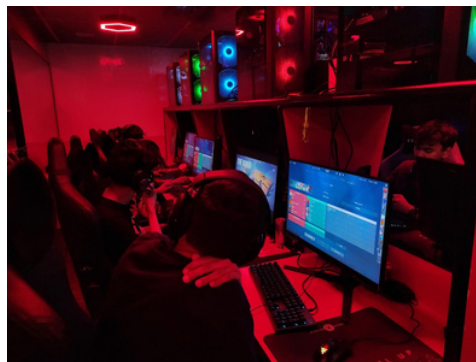
## TECHSPARK

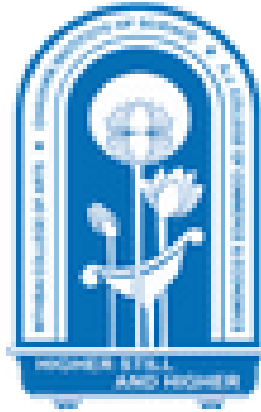

Mithibai College Jitendra Library organized a Display on “**World Braille Day**” on 4th January 2023.

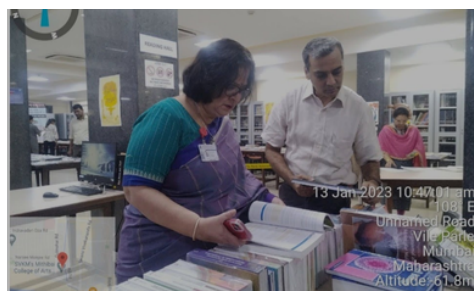
